Report on “Har Ghar Tiranga (From 9 August 2026 to 17 August, 2026)

Introduction

The **Har Ghar Tiranga (HGT) Campaign 2026** was observed at Atomic Energy Central School-1, Tarapur, from August 9 to August 17, 2026, under the aegis of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav. The campaign was conducted alongside the third phase of the commemoration of **150 years of the National Song “Vande Mataram”**, under the guidance of the Ministry of Education, Government of India. The campaign aimed to encourage citizens to hoist the National Flag at their homes and develop a personal and emotional bond with the Tiranga.

It also sought to promote patriotism, unity, national pride and active public participation, or Janbhagidari.

Objectives and Activities

Students, teachers and parents were encouraged to participate actively in the following activities:

- Hoisting the National Flag at home in accordance with the Flag Code of India.
- Uploading a **“Selfie with Tiranga”** on the official Har Ghar Tiranga portal: harghartiranga.com.
- Downloading certificates of appreciation from the Ministry of Culture after uploading their selfies.
- Attending special morning assemblies on the significance of the National Flag and India's freedom movement.
- Participating in flag-hoisting ceremonies, patriotic songs, cultural programmes and pledge-taking activities.
- Learning and singing the National Song, **“Vande Mataram,”** with the help of educational resources available on the official portal.

2.Special Assembly
